



# STUDENT TIP SLIPS

## USING READING TIME MORE EFFECTIVELY

**Let's examine some ideas that may help reduce reading time:**

- Some of what we read is not essential to the meaning or to the understanding of what has been said. The ideas are important; don't become too involved with reading "words". Look at key words, usually the verbs and nouns. Underline, make notes, and then just scan the descriptive passages.
- Try to read ideas rather than single words.
- Don't try to read when your mind is drifting; making notes will help you stay on topic. If you aren't thinking about the material you read, you may as well not read at all.
- Some people subvocalize (say what they read under their breath). This slows the rate of reading down considerably. You can read much faster than you can talk. Don't talk.
- Try to avoid having to re-read material for understanding. Read it properly the first time.



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
