

# Rubric for Communication Responses

TIK 2O, ICS 3M, ICS 4M

A communication response should follow proper English structure. That is, your response should have a thesis, supporting points and a conclusion. Proper spelling and grammar is expected.

Since communication can come in many forms, this rubric is intended for the case where a written response is required. Illustrations may be used to supplement the written response. In this case, the quality of the illustration and how well it is used to support your written argument will be evaluated.
