NATURAL SIGN, ACCIDENTALS

n is a Natural Sign. It cancels a sharp or a flat.

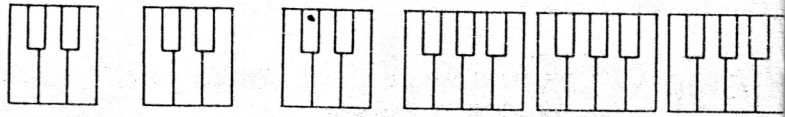
Sharps or flats can appear in two different ways:

1. As part of the **KEY SIGNATURE** at the beginning of a song. As an example, if an F# and a C# appear in the key signature (key of D) of a song, then all F's and C's in that song are to be played as F sharps and C sharps.
2. To sharp or flat a particular note in the body of a song. This added sharp or flat does not continue on, but ends with the end of the measure in which it appears. A #, b or n added in the body of a song is called an **ACCIDENTAL**.
