e-Learning Day School

If you are TDSB secondary student who is interested in taking an online, mostly asynchronous course as part of your timetable, the e-Learning Day School program may be for you. e-Learning courses are primarily asynchronous and run for a full semester. Teachers deliver synchronous lessons weekly for about an hour. Students are expected to log in daily and to keep up-to-date with their assignments.

TDSB Arts Co-op Program - Visual & Media Arts Focus

The TDSB Arts Department's Arts Co-op, a full-day, Semester 2 Arts Co-op, in partnership with the Urban Indigenous Education Centre (UIEC), is available for grade 11 and 12 co-op students. This program addresses Truth and Reconciliation Calls to Action #83 (We call upon the Canada Council for the Arts to establish, as a funding priority, a strategy for Indigenous and non-Indigenous artists to undertake collaborative projects and produce works that contribute to the reconciliation process), inviting Indigenous and non-Indigenous students to create collaborative projects supporting reconciliation.

Program Highlights:

- 5 credits (4 co-op + 1 dual credit)
- 4 days/week at <u>VIEC@16 Phin Avenue</u>, and 1 day/week at <u>Seneca@York</u> (Digital Design course)
- · Areas of focus include photography, film, painting, drawing, mixed media, and digital arts
- Opportunities for portfolio building and mentorship with local artists
- Students receive TTC PRESTO cards, tech access, and art supplies
- Food security support may be available

If you would like to be nominated for this award, please complete the following 3 questions from the Queen's Practice Application:

- Indicate your involvement in 5 activities that you are most proud of and that exemplify your leadership, and engagement in school/community service
 - Your response should be in a chart similar to the one on the Queen's practice application and limited to one page

- 2) As part of an experience where you demonstrated your leadership, what challenges did you encounter? How did you respond and what did you learn about leadership from this experience.
 - Prepare your answer to this question on a one-page document. Please ensure that your answer is anonymous. (i.e do not include your name, and use gender neutral pronouns)
- 3) Original and creative thinking are attributes we assess when considering the recipients for our major admission awards. Please attach a one-page document that demonstrates in your own way how you meet these criteria.
 - The one page document can be anything that you would like.
 Past examples have included: a short story, a poem, an essay, a collage of pictures, a drawing etc.
 - please ensure that your response to this is also anonymous.


