The Loran Scholars Foundation offers over 130 scholarships to deserving Canadian students. While academics plays a part in the selection process (minimum 85% average), the Loran award places special emphasis on a student's character.

There are two different ways that you can apply:

- 1. Sponsored Pool: These students are selected by the school. Each high school can sponsor up to 3 students.
- 2. Direct Pool: Applications not sponsored by the school

- About You List 5 interesting facts about you that will help us better understand who you are (100 character limit per response)
- Essay Question Describe your most significant volunteer contribution. Why did you do it? How did it impact others? (word limit: 300)
